In 2022/23 our learning disabled artists continued to excel in their creativity across music, film, spoken word, TV and radio. This report highlights some of the brilliant work they've been up to.



WELCOME

We've had a smashing year. Our projects started being 'in person' again. We've been getting back out there, and it was so good to get away from our screens and see people again.

Blue Camel Club was back! It was amazing to get everyone in the room. It was buzzing with energy, music, and people seeing each other for the first time in ages.

Oska Bright's Welcome Back work stepped into its second year. We had a brilliant time visiting HOME in Manchester and working with the team there to welcome learning disabled audiences back through their doors.

Another highlight for me was getting to work on **Oska Bright DIY**, supporting the next generation of film enthusiasts to create their own festival experience.

Carousel TV returned for a second series, bringing a wide range of entertainment to audiences across the UK.

Our musicians have also had a busy year producing new music and touring around the country.

I've been in my role of Chair of Trustees for a year now. It's been a challenging but fun experience, and I'm buzzing about the future of Carousel.

PROJECTS

ARTS CAFÉ

• Spoken Word artists and Chorus members developed their material and performances in workshops. They tried out different ways of performing their work and built their skills.

Carousel hosted three Arts Café events where the artists came together to produce and perform their work for new audiences. There was also an 'open mic' section for any new poets to step up and share their work.

BLUE CAMEL CLUB

• Blue Camel Club was back. We worked with Brighton Festival to bring the club to three new places in Brighton welcoming old and new faces alike.

• We also returned to **The Old Market**. We refreshed the club bringing in new ideas and new acts alongside our experienced DJs and we catered for a wide variety of musical tastes.

DJ Kez visited two learning disabledled club nights – Shoosh Club in Brighton and The Bubble Club in London – and talked with clubbers and staff about making the learning disabled club scene better and more exciting.

CAROUSEL RADIO

 12 radio shows were produced by our Radio team and broadcast on Radio Reverb. Our podcast had over 3500 listens online.



We invited 13 guest presenters to co-host shows and featured an additional 27 artists.

MUSIC

CAROUSEL ANTHEM

Eleven Carousel musicians

undertook a new project in summer 2022 when they came together to write a new song in celebration of **Carousel's 40th birthday**.

We invited new musicians who played lots of different instruments and brought new musical styles to enrich the piece.

We supported our learning disabled bands and musicians to tour to six venues around the UK. They included Beat Express, The Black Bawlerz, Fuzzbomb Flash Band, F.witch and solo artists Ryan O'Donovan, Bubbaloo, Mac Perry and Daniel Wakeford. • By partnering with **Gig Buddies** we were able to work together to reach new audiences. We think that over **65%** of the audiences were new to us and venues told us that it was the first time they had seen learning disabled people perform.

CAROUSEL CHORUS

As well as working on Arts Café, Carousel Chorus recorded a new EP. The Chorus met to choose, rehearse and record the tracks for their EP. They also did a professional photo shoot and designed a new logo.

Five new pieces were recorded by producer **Jimi Ashmore** at **Lift Studios**. It was a great new experience for the Chorus to work with an expert to produce each track.

FILM & DIGITAL

OSKA BRIGHT FILM FESTIVAL

• The Oska Bright Film Festival screened 407 films to over 6000 people on tour across the UK. The plan was to reconnect with audiences and their love of cinema.

As part of our touring activity, we partnered with Back to Back Theatre Company, supporting the release of their new work, Shadow. Oska Bright Films played to audiences across the UK before performances and screenings.

As part of Welcome Back, we worked with HOME Manchester, Glasgow Film Theatre, Storyhouse and The Barbican to support them to welcome learning disabled audiences to their venues.

• At **Storyhouse**, we helped them establish a learning disabled programming group who developed their own screening for a festival.

OSKA BRIGHT DIY

Oska Bright Do It Yourself supported school groups of young learning disabled people to plan, develop and deliver their very own Oska Bright Film Festival screening event. They learned all aspects of producing a screening, marketing it, and running the event.

We worked with two schools outside Brighton and teamed them up with their local independent cinema

• Oska In A Box shared the festival experience with learning disabled people unable to attend at a cinema. We worked with **MENCAP** to reach as many people as possible.

The boxes included popcorn, tickets, posters and lanyards and we had people watching screenings online from Northern Ireland, Wales, Jersey, Kent, Sussex, Manchester, Bristol, Nottingham, Newcastle, London and Liverpool.

CAROUSEL TV & MEDIA TEAM

• Season two of Carousel TV featured four episodes showcasing a range of creative talent from Carousel as well as guest features from organisations like Heart n Soul, Rudely Interrupted and Arty Party.

The shows were broadcast on **Latest TV** in Brighton and other TV channels in Birmingham, Bristol, Leeds, Cardiff, Liverpool, Newcastle, Teeside, North Wales, Manchester, Nottingham, Kent, Sheffield and Belfast. We also put Carousel TV on **YouTube** for anyone who missed the shows.



The show was made by our Media Team of learning disabled producers and creatives who worked with **Big Egg Productions** and **Steve Oram** to steer the direction of the show.

CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE

Our learning disabled artists delivered workshops for learning disabled children and young people. They included a variety of arts activities for people to try.



This year also saw Gus Garside retire from Carousel. Gus has been coordinating Creative Minds since 2014 including overseeing the delivery of a number of national conferences.
